BILATERAL ENERGY AGREEMENTS

In connection with the ongoing Energy Governance Partnership (EGP) Denmark has entered into bilateral energy agreements with the United Kingdom. These agreements are called memorandum of understanding (MoU) and are an important foundation for the EGP cooperation as well as for Danish-British cooperation within energy both between public institutions and businesses.

Scotland (Scottish Government)

2018

Denmark signs a MoU with Scotland. Main objectives of the agreement include:

- Decarbonisation of heating systems
- District heating
- Energy efficiency in buildings.

2021

Denmark signs a new MoU with Scotland. Main objectives of the agreement include green transition of the energy system. Specific main areas of cooperation are:

- District heating
- Energy efficiency in buildings and industry.

United Kingdom (Department for Energy Security & Net Zero) 2023

Denmark and the UK are planning to sign a MoU on energy on clean energy energy transition. Specific areas of cooperation are likely to include:

- Offshore wind
- Green hydrogen
- Power-to-x
- Carbon capture (usage) and storage
- Heat networks
- Energy efficiency
- Industrial decarbonisation.
